#### Sermon Ideas

## Servant Evangelism Ideas



Most of us take laundry for granted. We simply gather up the dirty laundry and sort it to go in the washer. However, around town there are some laundromats. Maybe you have not been in one for a long time. People who come there may be there for a variety of reasons. Perhaps their washer is broken. Maybe they are in transition and don't have access to their normal equipment. Sometimes they have

come in to wash a large item too big for the washer at home. However, everybody needs to wash clothes sometime.

One idea you could try is going to one of these laundromats and offering to pay for one load of clothes and also handing them something to look at while they wait. How about giving out some fresh baked cookies. You might turn a task that they dreaded into a God Appointment, where you could strike up a conversation and be a witness. When you catch people doing something routine and let them know you care, you never know what might happen!

#### **Children's Connection**



When you think about helping our children understand the concept of missions, there are some important building blocks. Children need to understand what a missionary does. They need to understand why a missionary does what they do. They need to understand that all Christians are to be missionaries. However, one key for helping them identify with missions is the need to put a face on missions. We have hun-

dreds of children, who are growing up in missionary families in a foreign country or in a church planting family here in the states with NAMB. Many times churches need help people make a personal connection. When thinking of children, they can be a powerful encourager to a child being raised in some form of a mission environment.
